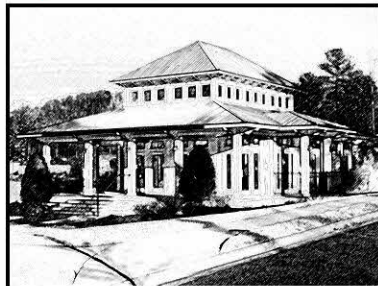
## Autumn is in the Air

### **Reminder--American Heritage Academy Student Drop Off and Pick Up**

The Board of Directors reminds parents of students enrolled at the American Heritage Academy use of the Club House Parking Lot is only for Lake Sovereign residents when dropping off or picking up their students. This privilege cannot be extended to guests or friends of residents. Our club house/pool parking lot is private property owned by the Lake Sovereign Homeowners Association and all paving and general maintenance of the lot is paid from homeowner maintenance fees.

In 2000 a group of residents, with children enrolled at American Heritage Academy, requested use of the back gate into the school for their children. These parents agreed to supervise the arrival and departure of their students each day and agreed to lock and unlock the gate on a daily basis. 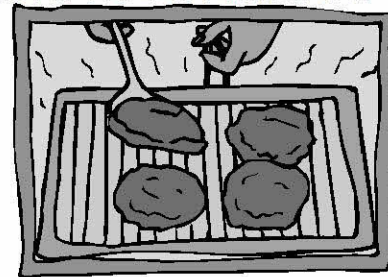
